
For the learner in each of us!

Influential Figures in Christianity

Many people over the centuries since Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection have had a great deal of influence on Christianity as a religious movement. Who were they and what were their beliefs? How did they change the way we see God, Jesus and faith? Each month this year we will look at an influential person in Christianity and reflect on what their contributions mean for us today. This month we will look at Constantine.



Constantine (272-337 AD) was a Roman emperor that was responsible for decriminalizing Christianity and ending the persecution of Christians. He was the first Roman emperor to convert to Christianity and Called the First Council of Nicaea, from which we get the Nicene Creed. He ordered the building of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem where it is believed the tomb where Jesus was laid after the crucifixion is located.

Key events during the life of Constantine:

Year	Event
293	Constantius I appointed <i>Caesar</i> by Diocletian. His son Constantine served in imperial court.
305	Constantius succeeds to rule the western empire, when Maximian retires.
306	Constantine proclaimed <i>Augustus</i> by the troops, on the death of his father.

308	Won great victories over the Marcomanni and Alamanni German.
311	Death of Galerius, co-emperor and persecutor of Christians.
312	At Battle of Milvian Bridge, Constantine fought under the sign of the cross.
313	Edict of Milan, assured Christians would be free to worship all over empire.
315	Won a great victory over the Vandals.
324	Defeated eastern ruler Licinius, and became sole emperor.
325	First Council of Nicaea, condemned the Arian Heresy.
326	Executed his son Crispus and second wife Fausta.
330	Constantine moved his court to Byzantium (later Constantinople.)
332	Defeated the Visigoths.
336	Reoccupied Dacia, abandoned by the empire since 271.
337	Died a natural death, after 30 year reign. Succeeded by sons Constantine, Constantius, and Constans.






THE LOVE CYCLE

Make a catch of fish to show what happens when Jesus calls his first disciples

What you need:

- Cardboard
- egg carton Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
 - Glue



What you do:

- 1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- 2. On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- 5. Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- 7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.
